

NCLEX Pass Rates Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Pre-licensure)

Aspen's BSN Pre-licensure program, currently in teach-out, prepares students to take the NCLEX-RN, the passing of which indicates readiness for licensing as a registered nurse. State Boards of Nursing in Arizona, Florida, Texas, and Tennessee have required annual first-time NCLEX-RN pass rates, although not all post quarterly or annual rates by school publicly. The following will be updated quarterly and then with the annual rate to indicate the most recent and available NCLEX-RN first-time pass rates by state in 2023.

As of the end of Q2, the Arizona State Board of Nursing has licensed 533 Aspen graduates. The Oregon Board has licensed 3; California, 4; Montana, 2; Oklahoma, 1; North Carolina, 1; Illinois, 1; Alaska, 1; Florida, 3; and Texas, 6. Aspen has added a total of 555 registered nurses to the workforce.

The Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) has accredited Aspen's BSN program, which includes the Pre-licensure track, through December 2029. CCNE Standard IV-C concerns licensure pass rates demonstrating program effectiveness as a measure of compliance. Option #4 is *the pass rate for each campus/site and track is 80% or higher for all takers (first-time and repeaters who pass) over the three most recent calendar years*. The Arizona location of the Pre-licensure track of the BSN program meets the benchmark at 82% for option #4 for calendar years 2020-2022.
