

Annual Institutional Report 2021

Released: April 2022

The purpose to the annual institutional report is to provide the initial set of trend data on enrollment, session to session persistence rate, year-over-year retention rate, graduation rate for undergraduate, and the 3-year cohort default rate. In addition, a glossary of terminologies is included to provide AU with the basic common term usage and their definition.

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Glossary of Terms

The following definition of term is based from Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) and AU catalog.

Term	Description					
Calendar Year (CY)	A 12-month period from January 1 to December 31.					
Cohort	A specific group of students established for tracking purposes.					
Completer/Graduate	A student who completed the program requirements and received a degree. The degree must be conferred in order to be a completer/graduate.					
Graduation Rate	The percentage of students in an established cohort that graduated within a specified time length.					
Headcount (HC)	An unduplicated count of enrolled student, faculty, or staff.					
On-Time Completion	A student completes the degree program on-time if he/she completed it within the amount of time that the program was advertised for.					
Session to Session A measure of the percentage of students re-enroll from one session to resistence Rate Persistence Rate next. Students that have graduated are excluded from the calculation.						
Race/ethnicity	Categories used to describe groups to which individuals identify with. The categories do not denote scientific definitions or anthropological origins. Ethnicity is self-reported and a student is counted in only one group. The categories of race or ethnicity are: • American Indian or Alaskan Native • Asian • Black or African American • Hispanic • Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander • White • Two or more races • Nonresident alien • Unknown					
One Year Retention Rate	e A measure of the percentage of students re-enrolled one year later. For example, students re-enrolled from fall term to the fall term of the following year.					
Session	Instructional period within the semester term. For example, fall semester has fall I and fall II sessions.
