

# Annual Institutional Report Key Data Point Trends 2024

#### Released: February 2025

The purpose to the annual institutional report is to provide the initial set of trend data on enrollment, session to session persistence rate, year-over-year retention rate, graduation rate for undergraduate, and the 3-year cohort default rate. In addition, a glossary of terminologies is included to provide AU with the basic common term usage and their definition.

### Highlights

- Enrollment 3,435 (Fall I 2023) to 2,372 (Fall I 2024) = 30.9% decrease
  - Iow market spend, high completions
  - 4 Average age increased from 43 to 44
  - ♣ More Fall I aggregate graduate level (1,375) than undergraduate level (997)
- Gender percentages have remained fairly steady between 2020 and 2024, respectively
  - Female: 85% to 84%
  - 🜲 Male: 15% to 16%
- Race/Ethnicity
  - "Resident Alien" has become "International Students"
  - Select Fall I 2024 percentages:
    - > 7% Hispanic (compared to 4% Fall I 2023)
    - > 8% Asian (compared to 7% Fall I 2023)
    - > 25% Black (compared to 24% Fall I 2023)
    - 46% White (compared to 52% Fall I 2023)
- Aggregate persistence (session to session): 61% (Sum I-Fall I 2022), 59% (Sum I-Fall I 2023), 69% (Sum I-Fall I 2024)
  - Undergrad persistence rate jumped from 59% to 71% (2023-2024), a 20.3% increase
  - ↓ Graduate persistence rate jumped from 59% to 68% (2023-2024), a 15% increase
  - 4 10 percentage point increase (2023-2024) due to initiatives of student services teams
- Aggregate retention (year over year): 46% (Fall I 2021-2022), 54% (Fall I 2022-2023), 55% (Fall I 2023-2024)
  - 4 19.6% improvement (Fall I 2021 to 2024) related to multi-departmental efforts
  - Undergrad retention rate settling at 50% (2024)
  - ♣ Graduate retention rate settling at 57% (2024)
- Faculty Credentials
  - 4 73% of Faculty hold a Doctoral degree

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#### Glossary of Terms


The following definition of term is based on the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) and the AU Academic Catalog.

Term	Description
Calendar Year (CY)	A 12-month period from January 1 to December 31.
Cohort	A specific group of students established for tracking purposes.
Completer/Graduate	A student who completed the program requirements and received a degree. The degree must be conferred in order to be a completer/graduate.
Graduation Rate	The percentage of students in an established cohort that graduated within a specified time length.
Headcount (HC)	An unduplicated count of enrolled student, faculty, or staff.
On-Time Completion	A student completes the degree program on-time if he/she completed it within the reported program length.
Session to Session Persistence Rate	A measure of the percentage of students re-enroll from one session to the next. Students that have graduated are excluded from the calculation.
Race/ethnicity	Categories used to describe groups to which individuals identify with. The categories do not denote scientific definitions or anthropological origins. Ethnicity is self-reported and a student is counted in only one group. The categories of race or ethnicity are: <ul> <li>American Indian or Alaskan Native</li> <li>Asian</li> <li>Black or African American</li> <li>Hispanic</li> <li>Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander</li> <li>White</li> <li>Two or more races</li> <li>Unknown</li> </ul>
One Year Retention Ra	te A measure of the percentage of students re-enrolled one year later. For example, students re-enrolled from fall term to the fall term of the following year.




Chart 2: Aggregate Enrollment Headcount by Level, Gender, and Year






Chart 6: Aggregate Year-Over-Year Retention Rate by Level




